

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant has established his qualifications for licensure as a casino key employee as required by N.J.S.A. 5:12-89(b)(1) and -89(b)(2) of the Casino Control Act (“**Act**”) based on the credible evidence submitted including Applicant’s voluntary agreement that he remain compliant with his Internal Revenue


Service (“IRS”) payment plan and provide proof to the Division of such compliance on an annual basis beginning March 15, 2020; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the approval of Applicant’s initial application for his casino key employee license is specifically conditioned upon Applicant providing the Division with proof of his compliance with his IRS payment plan on an annual basis beginning March 15, 2020 by sending a copy of all relevant documentation, including proof of payment, to:

Turrano, Jr. temporary casino key employee license #9857-11, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-89(e), and found Mr. Turrano temporarily qualified to serve as Vice President Food and Beverage Operations of casino licensee AC Ocean Walk LLC (AC Ocean) (Resolution No. 18-06-21-00); and

WHEREAS, the Division filed a letter report dated February 26, 2019, recommending that the Commission find Mr. Turrano plenary qualified to

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serve as Vice President Food and Beverage Operations for AC Ocean and grant his initial application for casino key employee license #9857-11; and

WHEREAS, the Commission considered the matter in its entirety at its public meeting on March 18, 2019;


WHEREAS, the Commission considered the entire record of this matter at its public meeting of March 18, 2019.



RESOLUTION OF THE NEW JERSEY CASINO CONTROL COMMISSION
CONCERNING THE PETITION OF BARTON BLATSTEIN FOR THE ISSUANCE
OF A STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 5:12-81a(1)
(PRN 0361805)

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2018, Barton Blatstein filed a petition (PRN 0361805) requesting that the New Jersey Casino Control Commission (Commission) issue a Statement of Compliance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-81a(1) regarding his qualification; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-81 to issue Statements of Compliance to any applicant for qualification status if the Commission is satisfied, upon the report and recommendation of the Division of Gaming Enforcement (Division), that the applicant has by clear and convincing evidence satisfied one or more eligibility criteria; and

WHEREAS, the Division filed a letter report dated February 28, 2019 recommending that the Commission find Mr. Blatstein plenary qualified; and

WHEREAS, the Division filed a letter report dated February 28, 2019 (Exhibit D-1, in evidence) recommending that the Commission issue a Statement of Compliance to Mr. Blatstein; and

WHEREAS, the Commission considered the entire record in this matter, together with the presentations of counsel and the testimony of Mr. Blatstein at its public meeting of March 18, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission based on the entire record of these proceedings and to the extent set forth in the findings



and rulings, a Statement of Compliance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-81 is **GRANTED** to Barton Blatstein as of March 18, 2019, as to his good character, honesty and integrity and financial stability, integrity and responsibility.


FINDINGS and RULINGS

1. Barton Blatstein has complied with all requirements regarding the submission of information necessary to the Commission and the Division to evaluate PRN 0361805 and shall have a continuing obligation to file any information required by the Division as a part of any application for a license or qualification, including information related to the eligibility criterion for which the Statement of Compliance is issued.

2. Barton Blatstein has established by clear and convincing evidence that he would, but for residency, be qualified for approval as a casino key employee pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-89b and is found qualified pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1.


