Galle is temporarily qualified and is hereby authorized to assume the duties and exercise the powers as a Regional Vice President of Marketing, Corporate subject to the conditions contained in *N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1c* and *N.J.A.C. 13:69C-2.6* and *2.7*.


