

Floorperson Supervision Of Automated Craps
Accounting and Internal Controls

Temporary Amendments: N.J.A.C. 19:45-1.12

Authority: N.J.S.A. 5:12-63, 69, 70, 99 and 100

The temporary rules follow:

Summary

“Automated craps” is a variation of the game of craps. See N.J.A.C. 19:47-1A.1 to 1A.8. Even though the game is played on a smaller blackjack-sized layout and patrons do not touch the dice, the game permits all customary craps wagers and does not require a stickperson or boxperson. For those reasons, the original Commission approval of the game did not permit automated craps to be included in a plan for revised supervision. See N.J.A.C. 19:45-1.12(e)1, 4 and 5.

Subsequent experience with the game has shown that automated craps is generally played at a much slower pace than craps or mini-craps. It is also played with a maximum of seven or eight seated players. Accordingly, the temporary amendments to N.J.A.C. 19:45-1.12(e)1 permit a floorperson to supervise up to six automated craps games under revised supervision. Temporary N.J.A.C. 19:45-1.12(e)4 and 5 also permit either two craps tables and one automated craps game, or one craps table and two automated craps games, to be supervised by one floorperson under revised supervision.

In light of the above changes for revised supervision, the temporary amendments also increase from two to four the number of automated craps tables (alone or in combination with certain other table games) permitted under standard supervision. See N.J.A.C. 19:45-1.12(c)5i, vi and vii.

Full text of the temporary adoption follows (additions are indicated in boldface **thus**; deletions are indicated in boldface brackets [thus]):

19:45-1.12 Personnel assigned to the operation and conduct of gaming

(c) Each casino licensee shall maintain the following minimum levels of staffing:

1. - 4. (No change.)

5. One floorperson shall supervise not more than:

i. Four tables comprised of any combination of table games excluding baccarat, minibaccarat (when using the dealing procedure in N.J.A.C. 19:47-7.7(c)3), craps, mini-craps[, automated craps] and pai gow; or

ii. - v. (No change.)

[vi. Two automated craps games;

vii. One automated craps table and two other table games, excluding baccarat, minibaccarat (when using the dealing procedure in N.J.A.C. 19:47-7.7(c)3), craps, mini-craps and pai gow; or]

Recodify viii. – ix. as **vi. – vii.** (no change in existing text.)

6. - 7. (No change.)

(d) (No change.)

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of (c) above, a casino licensee may implement a plan for revised supervision by floorpersons, poker shift supervisors, pit bosses or slot shift managers. A plan for revised supervision of table games shall not include any gaming tables at which the cards shall be used for more than 24 hours pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:46-1.18(g)7. In any plan for revised supervision:

1. One floorperson may supervise not more than six tables comprised of any combination of table games excluding baccarat, minibaccarat (when using the dealing procedure in N.J.A.C. 19:47-7.7(c)3), craps, mini-craps, [automated craps,] pai gow and blackjack when offering the streak wager permitted under N.J.A.C. 19:47-2.22);

2. - 3. (No change.)

4. One floorperson may supervise two craps tables and one additional table of any other table game excluding baccarat,

minibaccarat (when using the dealing procedure in N.J.A.C. 19:47-7.7(c)3), mini-craps[, automated craps] and pai gow;

5. One floorperson may supervise one craps table and two additional tables comprised of any combination of table games excluding baccarat, minibaccarat (when using the dealing procedure in N.J.A.C. 19:47-7.7(c)3), mini-craps[, automated craps] and pai gow;

6. - 8. (No change.)
