Borgata entered into a stipulation with the Division, as did Mr. Martin, in settling this matter. Borgata paid a substantial fine, and everyone would like to move forward now.

And we -- I strongly recommend the -the approval of Mr. Martin's license. And we
sent in a number of recommendation letters.
He's a 27-year casino executive without a
blemish before this event.
