5	MR. NANCE: Good morning.
6	The matters discussed in closed session

8	The Commission approved the June 13th,
9	2012, closed-session minutes.
10	Litigation update regarding: Brooks
11	versus the Casino Control Commission and
12	Edwards versus Adamar of New Jersey, Inc., et
13	al.
14	Item No. 1, ratification of the minutes
15	of June 13th, 2012, public meeting.
16	VICE CHAIR HARRINGTON: I'd move that we
17	ratify the minutes.
18	COMMISSIONER FANELLE: Second.
19	CHAIR KASSEKERT: The motion has been
20	made and seconded. All in favor?
21	(Ayes.)
22	CHAIR KASSEKERT: Opposed?
23	(No response.)
24	CHAIR KASSEKERT: Motion carries.

1	Chair Linda Kassekert and Commissioner Edward
2	Fanelle.
3	Vice Chair Harrington?
4	VICE CHAIR HARRINGTON: Yes. I am
5	pleased to move these two resolutions.
6	Resolution one is commending Linda M.
7	Kassekert for distinguished service to the
8	Commission. And it reads:
9	Whereas Linda M. Kassekert was appointed
10	Chair of the New Jersey Casino Control
11	Commission by Governor Jim McGreevey, becoming
12	the first female appointee to this position,
13	and began her tenure on November 12th, 2002,
14	she was reappointed by Governor Jon Corzine to
15	a second term commencing August 4th, 2007;
16	And, whereas, Chair Kassekert served the
17	Commission and the people of the State of New
18	Jersey with great distinction from 2002 to
19	2012, continuing the time-honored tradition of
20	excellence established by her predecessors;
21	And, whereas, she has demonstrated the
22	highest level of personal integrity,
23	scholarship, and dedication in fulfill her
24	duties and responsibilities as Chair of the

25 Commission thereby enhancing the public trust

1	and confidence in the regulation of casino
2	gaming in Atlantic City;
3	And, whereas, her extraordinary legal
4	talents, acute insight, and perceptive analysis
5	of complex issues aided immeasurably in the
6	Commission's decision-making process during a
7	critical period in the development of the
8	casino gaming industry;
9	And, whereas, her wisdom,
10	professionalism, and independence and tenacity
11	earned her praise, respect, and admiration of
12	her colleagues and the entire casino gaming
13	community;
14	And, whereas, she has been a tenacious
15	advocate and tireless watchdog in her efforts
16	to ensure the continuing integrity of the
17	casino regulatory process and relentless in her
18	efforts to help revitalize Atlantic City and
19	restore it as a convention and entertainment
20	center and a destination resort, achieving the
21	distinction of presiding over of the opening of
22	two new Atlantic City casinos, the Borgata
23	Hotel and Casino in 2002, and at the
24	commencement of her tenure at the

25 commencement of her tenure, and the Revel in

1 2012 at the conclusion of her tenure; 2 And, whereas, the Commission will sorely 3 miss but long remember her sense of style, hearty laugh, and devotion to the boardwalk 4 5 cats; And, whereas, it is fitting and 6 7 appropriate to commend Linda M. Kassekert for 8 her noteworthy achievements and special 9 contributions to the Commission, the State of 10 New Jersey, and to the casino gaming industry during her distinguished service; 11 12 Now, therefore be it resolved that the 13 Casino Control Commission and its staff hereby 14 expresses their gratitude to Linda M. Kassekert 15 for her invaluable service to the Commission, 16 to the proper regulation of casino gaming, and to the realization of the ultimate social and 17 18 economic purpose of the Casino Control Act and 19 for her good will and friendship; 20 And be it further resolved that the 21 Commission and its staff hereby extend our best wishes to Linda Kassekert in all of her future 22 endeavors. And be it revolved that this 23 24 resolution be placed in the record as a

25 commemoration of our sincere appreciation and

1	heartfelt best wishes.
2	So, Linda, congratulations and all the
3	best.
4	CHAIR KASSEKERT: Thank you.
5	(Applause.)
6	CHAIR KASSEKERT: Thank you. Thank you.
7	Thank you. Well, of course, you
8	couldn't get away me not making a few remarks.
9	So let me do that.
10	And let me first thank Chair Vice
11	Chair Harrington. I'm indeed very honored by
12	this resolution. And, you know, I guess I
13	never expected ten years ago when I was first
14	appointed that the time would move so quickly,
15	and here I sit today ready to undertake a new
16	challenge, to which I am very grateful for to
17	Governor Christie as I move on and resume my
18	responsibilities with the Office of
19	Administrative Law.
20	And, you know, as Commissioner
21	Harrington alluded to, what a ten years this
22	has been. The opening of the Borgata in 2003,
23	the relicensing probably of all the casino
24	properties as we've moved through, sometimes

25 more than once. The opening of new hotel

1	towers at Harrah's and Trump, Borgata, and
2	Resorts, providing more rooms for Atlantic
3	City. The sale and implosion of the Sands
4	Casino. We saw many a refinancing of a number
5	of the licensees and the entrance of private
6	equity entities into the market as sources of
7	funds. And casino gaming revenues, of course,
8	hitting 5.2 billion in 2006.
9	And we had many challenges, the shutdown
10	of State government and ultimately shutting
11	down the casinos in 2006. And, of course, the
12	denial of the license for Tropicana which was a
13	very difficult decision for the Commission and
14	the appointment of Justice Stein as
15	conservator. And after a long and arduous
16	process, the property was ultimately sold and,
17	thankfully, never closed. The downturn in the
18	economy and competition has brought new
19	challenges to the industry and to all of us.
20	As revenues grew in other states, Atlantic City
21	saw gaming revenues decline. We saw casinos
22	file for bankruptcy, and we were concerned
23	there would be closings and loss of jobs.
24	And we also saw challenges as an agency

25 as we implemented the legislative mandate which

1	was expressed in S12. And I believe that the
2	Casino Control Commission has emerged all the
3	stronger as we enacted our new mission. And,
4	of course, this year the licensing and opening
5	of Revel Entertainment, which has brought a
6	whole new perspective to Atlantic City and
7	and very exciting.
8	And, as I said, those ten years went
9	very quickly.
10	Let me extend a few thank yous. First
11	to the gaming attorneys; hello, Lloyd. Both
12	in-house counsel and outside. I have
13	appreciated your professionalism and your
14	creativity as we face new challenges and
15	changes to the statute.
16	To our sister agencies, the Division of
17	Gaming Enforcement, and especially to Director
18	Rebuck, to the attorneys there that I have had
19	the opportunity to work with over the years,
20	thank you.
21	To the Commissioners I have served with,
22	Commissioners Fedorko, Epps, Frulio, Sommeling,
23	and especially Commissioners Harrington and
24	Fanelle. It was a pleasure working with all of

25 you.

1 And let me extend my best wishes to 2 Matt Levinson and Alisha Cooper as they assume their new responsibilities here at the 3 Commission. 4 And last but not least, the staff of the 5 Casino Control Commission. Thank you for all 6 7 your support, your hard work, but especially 8 your professionalism, your ability to adapt, 9 your flexibility in accepting new challenges. 10 I will miss all of you. And I know you will continue to excel as the new administration 11 12 begins. 13 And let me especially thank Zig --14 Zigrid -- Tracy, and Donna, who kept me 15 straight all these years. And especially my 16 senior staff, Dianna, David, and Jim. You were -- you exemplified what State employees 17 18 should be. And your hard work and your 19 dedication never went unnoticed by me, and, I 20 know, the members of the Commission. 21 So as I said, I'm beginning -- I'm

22 getting ready to assume a new challenge. I'm 23 taking some vacation time, which is good. And 24 I look forward to following what goes on here

25 in Atlantic City with Matt as Chair and Alisha

1	and Sharon continuing on as commissioners.
2	And thank you for the opportunity and
3	thank you for coming today.

20	confidence in the regulation of casino gaming
21	in Atlantic City;
22	And, whereas, he has exhibited honesty,
23	dignity, and compassion in discharging his
24	duties and ensuring that all individual

25 applicants and respondents were treated fairly,

1	and equitably;
2	And, whereas, his passion
3	professionalism, tenacity, and wisdom earned
4	him the respect and admiration of his
5	colleagues and the entire casino gaming
6	community;
7	And, whereas, his steady temperament,
8	attention to detail, and perceptive analysis of
9	the myriad complex issues confronting his
10	agency aided immeasurably in the Commission's
11	decision-making process;
12	And, whereas, it is fitting and
13	appropriate to commend Edward Fanelle for his
14	noteworthy achievements and special
15	contributions to the Commission, the State of
16	New Jersey, and to the casino gaming industry
17	during his distinguished service;
18	Now therefore be it resolved that the
19	Casino Control Commission and its staff hereby
20	express our gratitude to Edward Fanelle for his
21	invaluable service to the Commission, for his
22	contributions to the proper regulation of
23	casino gaming, and to the realization of the
24	ultimate social and economic purposes of the

25 Casino Control Act and for his good will and

1	friendship;
2	And be it further resolved that the
3	Commission and its staff hereby extend our best
4	wishes to Edward Fanelle in all your future
5	endeavors;
6	And be it further resolved that this
7	resolution be placed in the record as a
8	commemoration of our sincere appreciation and
9	heartfelt best wishes.
10	I so move.
11	CHAIR KASSEKERT: And I'll second that
12	motion.
13	VICE CHAIR HARRINGTON: Thank you.

15	CHAIR KASSEKERT: The motion has been

22	COMMISSIONER FANELLE: Thanks.
23	(Applause.)
24	COMMISSIONER FANELLE: I really don't

25 have any prepared comments, but I will just

1 sort of highlight a few things. 2 And the re -- the people that they've 3 selected to be Linda and I's replacement, one of the things you don't have to do -- not being 4 5 from Atlantic City or from the area when I 6 first was appointed and came down, I had Mike 7 Epps drive me through the complete city. Now, 8 I worked the Atlantic City Expressway as a 9 trooper, but I never really got to see the 10 inner workings of the city. So we took about a 11 day, and we went through, and he showed me all 12 the little sections and all the innuendos, and 13 things like that. So I'm glad that you don't 14 have to go that learning curve, that you're 15 already versed in what goes on in the city, so 16 you're already one step ahead of where I was when I came. 17

18The other thing is, I don't think we19should lose sight as a community of -- of the20industry, the Division of Gaming Enforcement,21the Casino Control Commission, the task force22to continue to work together to move Atlantic23City forward to a destination resort.24Sometimes people get distracted in what they're

20

25 doing, and they become sometimes overwhelmed,

1	and they lose sight of what the goal is. The
2	goal is to make Atlantic City successful. So I
3	hope that that is one of the premier points
4	moving forward by all the affected members of
5	the area and to move Atlantic City in a
6	prideful, respectful manner forward and to make
7	it the great place it can be. But it has to be
8	done collectively.
9	And last but not least, the people that
10	are most near and dear to me are the Casino
11	Control Commission employees. Every day I
12	would walk around. You know, they gave me
13	pom-poms one time because I was the cheerleader
14	for the organization.
15	(Laughter.)
16	COMMISSIONER FANELLE: But it was
17	because I had 28 years of State service in, and
18	I've seen these people work hard every day,
19	whether it was the deregulation or the you
20	know, the things that they had to go through.
21	They still kept their desire. They still kept
22	their integrity. They still kept their
23	dedication. And sometimes when you see that
24	that intensity I know for the trooper in the

21

25 back of the room, when we had to go through

1 the -- you know, the racial profiling issue and 2 the mandates from the federal government, a lot of guys got upset and, you know, were 3 disappointed and didn't perform the way that 4 5 they should. I didn't see that in any of our 6 employees. So it was my honor and privilege to 7 work with the people from the Commission. And 8 hoping that the Commission employees will move 9 the Commission into the next generation and 10 into the next level of proficiency. 11 And I would like to thank the governor 12 for allowing me to work under his 13 administration. It's a been a sincere, you 14 know -- a very big honor for me. Working with 15 Linda and Sharon and Bill and Mike. You know, 16 they're no longer here. We're down to three 17 commissioners now. 18 So you have your agenda ahead of you, Incoming Chair. I think you'll handle it with

Incoming Chair. I think you'll handle it with great dignity and respect. And if you ever need anything, just, you know, don't feel -don't hesitate to call.
