The petition before you is for the issuance of a New Jersey casino key employee license for Michael Salmon, along with a waiver of the New Jersey residency requirement in accordance with N.J.S.A. 5:12-89(b)(4). Mr. Salmon is a Caesars Entertainment corporate team member who requires a New Jersey casino key employee license to perform casino credit support services for both Caesars Entertainment Atlantic City and Harrah's Atlantic City, which services are needed at this time.
