How dare someone come in and have the nerve to say, oh, we're going to allow smoking. Because, you know, most of customers are Asian. And they spend a lot of money and gamble. They gamble everywhere. There's no smoking allowed. Come on. And they're going to love you.

You're going into the winter season. What's going to draw people here? They can gamble in

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their car, in the bathroom, anywhere. What's going to draw them in? You need people to ask that question, because you're losing it.

Businesses, if you go online, your
reputation precedes you, which is negative. In most
of the casinos in Vegas, they talk to you. Anybody
that works there has to say, hi, welcome to Las Vegas.
Where you from? Okay, it's so important. On their
badge it says where they're born and where they're
from. It tells you that we want you here. We invite you. Have fun. Spend money.

This is the wonderland of the world, okay, Atlantic City. You can swim, you can fish, and guess what, gamble. And now we even have things for your kids. Everywhere you look, north, south, east and west, kids can be there. So when you're on vacation it's not daddy going. Let's all go and have fun. That's it. Thank you.
